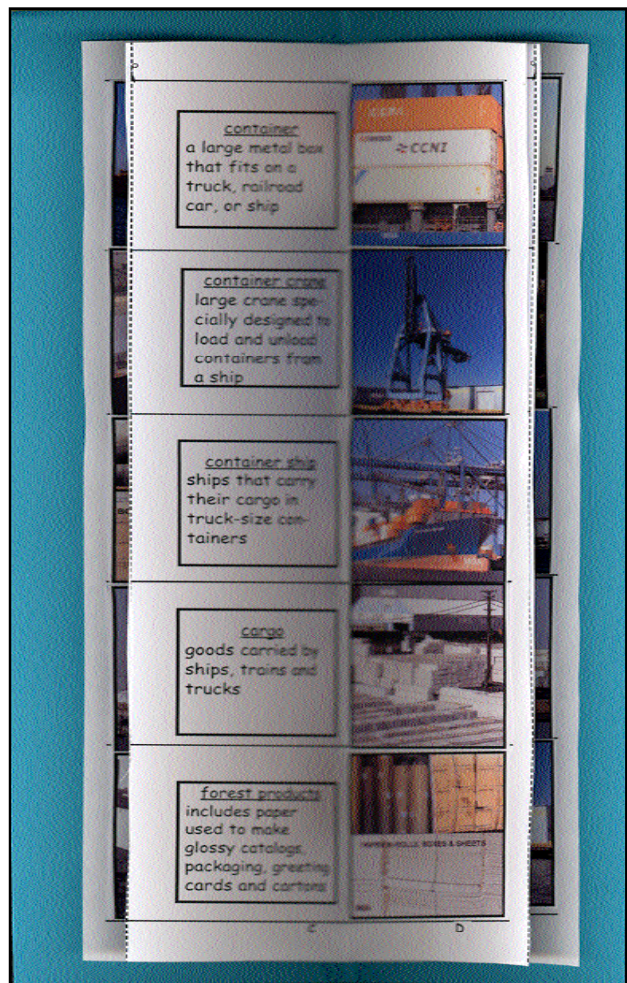
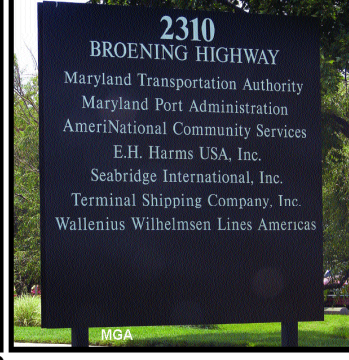
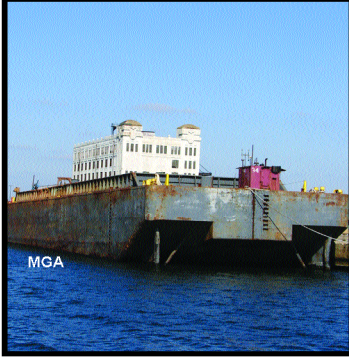


The Port of Baltimore Glossary Activity

1. Cut out the photograph boxes.
2. Correctly match each photograph to the vocabulary definitions. Then glue each photograph next to the definition.
3. Take pages with dotted lines and cut them in half on the dotted line. Next, fold each sheet in half "hot dog" style.
4. Glue side "B" to side "C". Next, glue side "F" to side "G". Now glue side "D" to side "E".
5. Cut a sheet of construction paper 5" x 11 1/2" and fold it in half "hotdog" style. Glue "A" to the inside of the cover and "H" to the inside of the back cover.
6. Cut out the title box and glue it on the front of the book.







barge
a broad boat with a flat bottom used chiefly in harbors and on rivers and canals

container
a large metal box that fits on a truck, railroad car, or ship

berth
a place where a ship may dock

container crane
large crane specially designed to load and unload containers from a ship

break-bulk cargo
as opposed to cargo in containers, or roll-on, roll-off cargo. Includes steel and machinery stacked on pallets which are lifted into and out of ships

container ship
ships that carry their cargo in truck-size containers

bulk cargo
cargo that can be poured into the hold of a ship

cargo
goods carried by ships, trains and trucks

coal pier
pier built for the handling of specialized bulk cargo (coal) into and off ships

forest products
includes paper used to make glossy catalogs, packaging, greeting cards and cartons

Key Bridge
a truss bridge build over the Patapsco River. This bridge completes the Port with the interstate highway system

Ro/Ro
roll-on, roll-off ships where cargo is driven on and off, such as automobiles, tractors, trucks, etc

intermodal
a combination of more than one mode of transportation

stevedore
person or a company who manages the operation of loading or unloading a ship

Patapsco River
a long large stream of water that flows across land. This forms the Port of Baltimore at the point where it connects the Port with the Chesapeake Bay

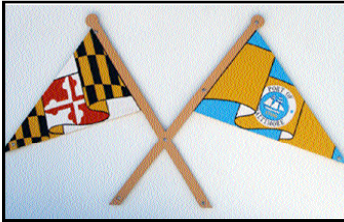
tank farm
a group of tanks connected to pipelines through which oil or other liquids are moved

pier
platform built out from the shore into the water and supported by piles

terminal
a place within a port where goods or people are loaded on or unloaded from a ship

port
a place where ships may dock or anchor, that has facilities for loading & unloading

warehouse
a building for storing goods and merchandise



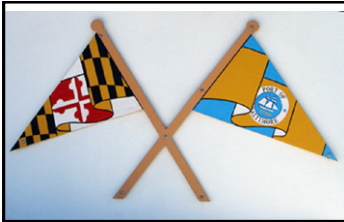
